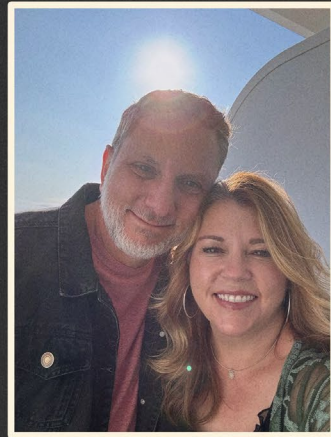

DAILY PRAYER

Pray this simple but powerful prayer every day: "Jesus, give me Your heart for people far from You." Ask Him to shape your perspective so you see others the way He does.

DAILY DEVOTIONAL

Walk with us through the Beyond Us Daily Devotional. Each day's reading will keep your heart rooted in Scripture and aligned with what God is doing in our church.

SUNDAY SERVICES

Commit to being part of worship every Sunday for the next four weeks. Each service builds momentum and unites us as one family moving forward together.

JOIN A GROUP

Don't walk this journey alone. Join a weekly Sunday study, Men's Group, Women's Group, or Small Group where real life-change happens. Text GROUPS to 55757 to get connected.

FAMILY PRAYER

Use the Family Prayer Guide inside the Beyond Us Journey Guide to gather your household in prayer. Grow closer to God as you grow closer to one another.

LISTEN TO GOD

Set aside four minutes of silence each day to listen for God's voice. Write down what He shows you so you can look back and see how He is leading.

FAST

Choose one thing to give up—food, social media, or another comfort—for 24 hours. Let the hunger or the pause remind you to depend on God in deeper ways.

+ Pray and ask God to give you the courage to move forward in faith.

+ Pray and ask God to replace your fear with His power and peace.

WEDNESDAY

Matthew 7:24-27

+ Pray and ask God to create in you a heart full of obedience to Him.

+ Pray and thank Christ for being the wisdom and power of God.

THURSDAY

+ Pray and ask God to show you how He wants you to invest in future generations.

FRIDAY

Matthew 25:14-30

+ Pray and ask God to use the abilities He has given you to multiply His kingdom.

SATURDAY

1 John 3:16

+ Pray and thank God for giving His Son sacrificially for you.

SMALL GROUP GUIDE

SCRIPTURE

LUKE 15:1-7 (NIV)

Now the tax collectors and sinners were all gathering around to hear Jesus. But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law muttered, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." Then Jesus told them this parable: "Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, 'Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent."

OBSERVATION

1. What can we notice about Jesus' posture toward people far from God? Why do you think sinners were drawn to Him?
2. In Luke 15, the shepherd leaves the 99 to go after the one. What does this reveal about God's priorities? How should this challenge the way we often live?
3. Why do you think Jesus emphasized that heaven rejoices more over one sinner who repents? How should this reshape our understanding of evangelism and church involvement?
4. Rusty reminded us that "Jesus was liked by people who were nothing like Him." Is that true of us today? How do we grow in that kind of love and grace?
5. In what ways have you (or have we as a church) focused more on the "99" than the "ONE"? How can we balance caring for the lost and helping the saved?

APPLICATION

PERSONAL CHALLENGE

- Pray daily: "God, give me Your heart for people far from You."
- Four minutes of silence: Start each day by listening to God.
- Fast: Give something up this week to help you hunger for God.
- Commit: Join or stay consistent in a Small Group.
- Engage: Use the Beyond Us Daily Devotional.

SMALL GROUP CHALLENGE

- Choose a time this week when everyone in your group will stop and pray the same prayer: "God, give me Your heart for people far from You."
- Choose one thing you're fasting from this week and share with the group why.
- Talk about your "one more." Who's someone far from God that you're praying for or reaching out to?
- Brainstorm together one way your group could live out the heart of Jesus for the "one more" this week.

SCRIPTURE

Spend a few minutes reading these passages aloud in the group. Invite someone to summarize the main idea from each one.

JOSHUA 1:1-9

2 TIMOTHY 1:7

PROVERBS 3:9-10

OBSERVATION

1. What stood out to you from the message or from the passages we read?
2. According to 2 Timothy 1:7, fear is not from God. How could recognizing fear as a "spirit" impact how we handle it?
3. What are some specific fears that were mentioned in the sermon that you personally relate to (e.g., fear of failing, fear of not having enough, fear of being vulnerable)?
4. In Joshua 1:1-9, how did God encourage Joshua to move forward even when things looked overwhelming? What could that teach us about dealing with fear?
5. Why do you think God sometimes asks us to take a step of faith before He acts?
6. What's the difference between fear and courage, based on the message?

APPLICATION

PERSONAL CHALLENGE

- What is your Jordan River? What's the fear, obstacle, or area of your life where God is asking you to take a step of obedience or trust?
- Is there a part of the Beyond Us journey (serving, giving, inviting others, connecting outside the church walls) that makes you uncomfortable or fearful?
- In what ways could fear be holding you back from spiritual growth or impact?

SMALL GROUP CHALLENGE

- As a group, challenge each person to identify one small step of courage they can take this week (e.g., have a hard conversation, pray a bold prayer, start giving, invite someone to church, forgive someone).

WEEK THREE

OCTOBER 12, 2025

RISK THAT GOES BEYOND

SCRIPTURE

MATTHEW 6:19–21 (NIV)

“Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”

PSALM 112:1–9 (NLT)

“Praise the Lord! How joyful are those who fear the Lord and delight in obeying his commands ... They share freely and give generously to those in need. Their good deeds will be remembered forever.”

OBSERVATION

1. What are the key contrasts Jesus makes in Matthew 6:19–21? What do you think is the difference between treasures on earth and treasures in heaven?
2. How does this teaching from Jesus in Matthew 6 challenge the way our culture views success, wealth, and legacy?
3. Psalm 112 describes the life of someone who fears God and lives generously. What qualities or actions stand out to you in this passage?
4. Psalm 112:9 says, “Their good deeds will be remembered forever.” What kind of deeds or lifestyle do you think this verse is talking about?
5. When you think about your own life, what “treasures” are you currently storing? Where would you say your heart is, based on how you spend your time, energy, and money?

APPLICATION

PERSONAL CHALLENGE

Key Thought: Legacy is not just about what we leave behind, but what we invest in today that will outlive us.

- What could your spiritual legacy look like?
- In what ways are you investing in eternity right now (time, talent, treasure)?
- What would it look like for you to become more intentional about leaving a legacy that matters in God’s Kingdom?
- Are there any changes you feel prompted to make in your giving, serving, or relationships?
- Write out a personal legacy statement this week (one sentence).
 - Example: “I want to be remembered as someone who loved people deeply and gave generously to advance God’s Kingdom.”
 - Then take one step toward living it—whether it’s through giving, serving, encouraging, or mentoring.

SMALL GROUP CHALLENGE

- How can your Small Group work together to make an impact beyond just this season?

WEEK FOUR

OCTOBER 19, 2025

SACRIFICE THAT GOES BEYOND

SCRIPTURE

Spend a few minutes reading these passages aloud in the group. Invite someone to summarize the main idea from each one.

GENESIS 22:1-14

ROMANS 12:1-2

HEBREWS 11:32-39

OBSERVATION

1. What stood out to you in this week's message or in the passages we read?
2. Why do you think God often calls people to do hard things throughout Scripture? Can you think of a story in Scripture, or maybe a personal one, that illustrates faithfulness during hardship?
3. How did Abraham respond to God's difficult command? What can that teach us about obedience and trust?
4. What do you think is the difference between loving God and loving what God gives us?
5. Read Hebrews 11 again. How did the "hard things" people faced strengthen their testimony? How does it strengthen ours today as we face challenges?
6. Rusty mentioned how people before us made hard sacrifices for our benefit. How does that challenge or inspire you today?

APPLICATION

PERSONAL CHALLENGE

- What's a hard thing God may be asking you to do right now (Could be relational, financial, emotional, spiritual, etc.)?
- Is there something in your life – like time, comfort, or money – you've been reluctant to lay on the altar?
- What's one sacrifice you could make this week to shift your focus beyond you?
- Will you participate in the Monday-Wednesday fast this week? What will you fast from?

SMALL GROUP CHALLENGE

- Close your group time by symbolically "laying it on the altar." Have each person write something they need to surrender to or trust God with on a small card. Place the cards in the center of the group and pray over them together.

WEEK FIVE
OCTOBER 26, 2025

COMMITMENT THAT GOES BEYOND

SCRIPTURE

Spend a few minutes reading these passages aloud in the group. Invite someone to summarize the main idea from each one.

2 CORINTHIANS 9:6-11

MATTHEW 6:21

ROMANS 12:1

OBSERVATION

1. Rusty said that “consecrate” means to declare or dedicate something as sacred or holy. It’s when we set apart ourselves or something else for God and His purposes. What might it mean to consecrate our financial commitment or ourselves?
2. What does Matthew 6:21 say about the connection between money and the heart? How do you see that truth playing out in your own life?
3. In 2 Corinthians 9:7, what is the posture God wants in our giving? What could it look like to give cheerfully and not under compulsion?
4. In what ways can your past commitments (financial, relational, spiritual) shape who you are today? How might a financial commitment to God's mission shape your future?

APPLICATION

PERSONAL CHALLENGE

- Is there something God is asking you to commit to that you've been hesitating on? How can you take one step of trust this week?
- What’s holding you back from giving now, in this season? Fill in the blank: “I’ll be generous once _____.”
- Think about an area where you’ve been playing it safe with God. How could He be leading you to take a bold step of faith in that area?

SMALL GROUP CHALLENGE

- To help us surrender our commitments to God, have everyone in the group close their eyes and place their hands out but with closed fists facing up. Have them envision their commitment in their fist. One by one, go around the room and have everyone say, “I trust You, Lord.” As they do, have them open their hands.

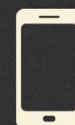
